Monthly Meeting 9-6-19

- 2. Motion made to accept minutes as published; seconded; passed, meeting started
- 3. Treasurer's report
 - a. Including savings, checking and everything, we are doing well for profits and stuff; slightly better than this time last year
 - b. Received invoice from Fremont; it was more than the last plane so Cory will look into it
 - c. No FJC's scheduled after turbine event

4. Training

- a. Goal right now is to retain students; focus should be to get students licensed before end of the season
- b. Likelihood of FJC's is low due to low instructor turnout; generally, if we have a jumpable day, we do have a few instructors present
- c. There are lights in the hangar; for anyone who uses it at night, check it out to see if you want more
- d. Lee B. looked at it and mentioned he might like more outlets to eliminate some of the extension cords; Rod F. and Rick B. were looking into this
- e. If you see a student just sitting off to the side and you're a coach/instructor, involve them in your packing process; helps for coaches/instructors to look at the proficiency card before coaching

5. Gear

- a. Rig 10 still out; the other two that we lost PC's are back in
- b. Aerodyne is taking their sweet time to send us replacement parts
- c. Heavy magnet in tandem rig #3 was replaced; or was it rig #1?
- d. Tandem supplies are in the drawer; Sonny ordered replacement parts for this stuff
- e. Just a reminder, closing loops should have no more than 10% wear; supplies for fixing barbs on the static lines are in the drawer
- f. We have a big supply of rubber bands now
- g. At last boogie, tandem packers were using our supplies and closing loops; they were making money so they should be able to afford their own rubber bands...Do we charge them? Or make them bring their own? Put the red bucket behind the counter?
- h. Sonny will take care of the rigs as they come in for repack
- i. Big big big thanks to Joe V. for doing the laundry on all the student jumpsuits

6. Demos

- a. One demo left on Thurs 9-12
- b. Big thanks to everyone who participated in the demos, for jumping, ground crew, flying, everything
- c. It's something we do that we enjoy and make money off of; could use some more cards; we'll get some more ordered
- d. We are looking for more people to get their C licenses and PRO ratings; keep in mind, PRO requirements are changing on the first of the year; talk to Travis if you're interested

- e. At Sonny's standardization meeting, he noted USPA is making a lot of changes; you'll have to video your landings for PRO ratings and you'll have to submit them to the regional directors
- f. USPA is raising the bar on everything; they will likely push harder to make sure we do our jobs better
- g. Many instructors have been asking; apparently, static line jumps do count as freefall jumps
- h. Tangent, tangent, tangent...

7. Building and grounds

- a. Could use more light and more outlets
- b. There's now an outdoor smoke pot for the smokers and a dog crap bag dispenser so clean up after yourselves and your pets

8. Old clubhouse

- a. Board talked about it a month ago but decided it was a big ticket item and should be left up to the members
- b. It's only being used a few times a year and as a bunkhouse, buffet line, etc.
- c. Utility expenses need to be considered; also, it needs a new roof seemingly every few years; siding is not worth investing in, it smells funny
- d. Some years ago, a proposal was made to demolish it, but it never happened
- e. What exactly happened that year? Meeting minutes don't necessarily tell the whole story
- f. Would it be possible to get rid of that old building and then make a new one? Having that extra toilet and shower is useful...Demo half of it and rebuild the other half? Having it is easier for people to stay and spend the night
- g. If we do make a new one, Sonny is volunteering to keep it clean (just kidding); we went through a lot of growing pains to put the new building up, so should we keep it for a few years and then decide
- h. Should we finish up the hangar, get the new building up and good, and then worry about it? Put power in the hangar first and fix the hangar door, and then worry about the building
